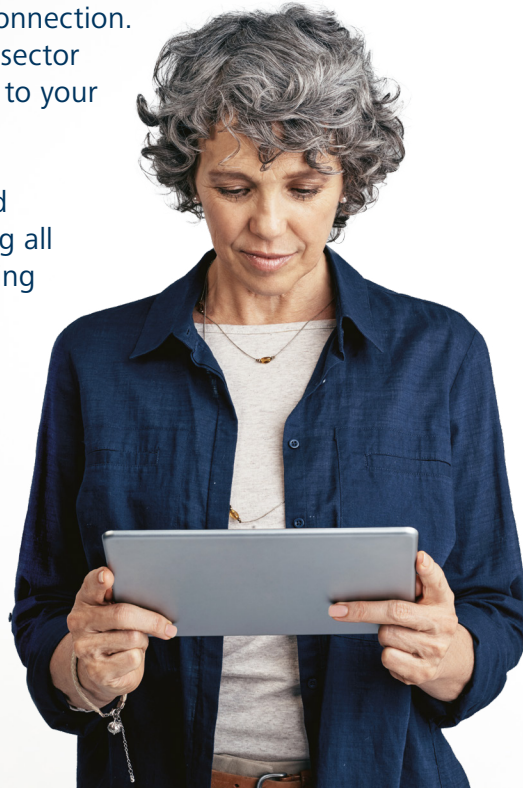

The EPR in a nutshell:

- The EPR is a digital collection of health information relevant to treatment.
- The EPR saves time and makes treatment more secure.
- The EPR provides important information quickly, including in an emergency.
- The Data Protection Act and the Federal Act on the Electronic Patient Record provide maximum security and protection for your EPR data.
- The EPR is voluntary and free of charge for people in Switzerland.
- Participation in the EPR is mandatory for inpatient healthcare facilities (e.g. clinics and nursing homes) and newly registered doctor's surgeries.
